

Peace. A "hot button" word these days, in our world and in the church. We all long for it. We all pray for it. Yet it always seems beyond our grasp. Benjamin Franklin said, "There has never been a good war, or a bad peace." Martin Luther King contrasted two kinds of peace: "... a negative peace, which is the absence of tension, to a positive peace which is the presence of justice." It has also been said that peace is not the absence of war, but the presence of God.

But wait – our English word peace can refer to some things other than the opposite or absence of war. The word peace doesn't mean the same thing every time we say it. We can have peace of mind about decisions we have made. After a hectic day at work or school we look forward to coming home for a little peace and quiet. However we might all be willing to wait just a little longer before resting in peace beneath the tombstone above.

For Christians and Jews alike, peace is at the heart of God's covenant with his people. Peace has always been God's intention for this world.

"Though the mountains be shaken and the hills be removed, yet my unfailing love for you will not be shaken, nor my covenant of peace be removed, says the Lord, who has compassion on you." (Isaiah 54:10)

New Testament writers used peace as a virtual synonym for gospel. Several texts speak of "the gospel of peace", or "the good news of peace". Paul writes of Jesus: "For he himself is our peace...". In the Old Testament, Isaiah prophesied the gift of God's son and said "And he will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father..." and in the Hebrew: "Sar Shalom", the Prince of Peace.

Shalom is the Hebrew word that we translate peace. Shalom appears in the Old Testament about 250 times and is rich with meaning, far broader than our English word peace. It is not merely the absence of things like war, danger, worry or fear. Rather it is more the presence of things, like wholeness, prosperity, health, happiness and success. I was surprised to learn that when Israel enjoyed times of absence of fighting they didn't use the word shalom, but rather the word that we translate "rest." ("...and the Lord had given Israel rest from all their enemies" Jer 23:1)

So what has God been saying to his children about peace? What did Jesus mean when he said "Peace I give to you. [but] Not as the world gives." How is the peace of Jesus different? For a few weeks during Randy's sabbatical we are going to look together at God's shalom. *(see p.3) What God has said - and what he has not said - about shalom. We'll consider what God is doing about shalom and what he might be calling us to do.

The Lord bless you and keep you;
The Lord make his face shine upon you and be gracious to you
The Lord lift up his countenance upon you and give you SHALOM.

Do you know the way to San Jose? An Update for the Youth Group

Are you up for a challenge? I sure hope you are because starting on the 30th of July; the Youth Group is challenging everyone else in the church to a Penny Challenge!

"What in the World is a 'Penny Challenge'?"

Well, let me tell you!

Both teams (the Youth and Everyone Else) will have their own jar. The goal is to put as many pennies in your jar and earn as many points as possible. Sounds easy enough, right? Well, there's a little twist. Every silver coin is negative the number of cents it is worth (Paper money works the same way as silver coins).

For example, if Richard Glick put 7 pennies in the Everyone Else jar, that team's score would be +7. But, then along comes Carol Whitney, a member of the Youth Team, and she puts a dime in the Everyone Else jar. That makes their score -3. So, put your pennies in your jar and all your other coins in the other teams jar. Let's see who has the highest score after 8 weeks of competition!

"What team am I on?"

Good question! The Youth Team is the Youth and their families, Carol Whitney, the Pejouhys, and the Becks. And the rest of you, everyone else, and therefore on the everyone Else team.

Every week the Youth will tally up the scores and then announce the new standings the next Sunday. We are open to suggestions for a new team name if you are unhappy with yours.

"What happens if my team wins?"

There's a PRIZE! It hasn't been finalized, but there are rumors circling that it might have to do with cleaning duties. Yes, you read that right, cleaning duties. Or, maybe you have a good idea for a prize, let the Youth Group know! And, even if your team doesn't win, just think, you had fun while giving the Youth Group your change! Is there anything better than that? I think not!

The Penny Challenge is on!

Just a Few Numbers To Think About:

I just wanted to let everyone know that the San Jose Convention website (www.sanjose2007.org) is up and running. I did a little quick math and I think it is going to cost us about \$7,000! (My numbers add up \$6,871, so I rounded up!)

As far as I know there are 8 people going. Carol Whitney and Nancy Pejouhy as leaders and McKenzie Clifford, Emily Glick, Bailey Bontrager, Hunter Cox, Hudson Cox, and me as youth. This means we will need 3 rooms (one for the sponsors, one for the girls, and one for the boys). This will cost about \$1,335. (3 rooms @ \$89 each for 5 nights).

Meals are going to be \$167 per person, so \$1,336 for the group.

Registration for both the youth and the sponsors is \$175 per person. This means it will cost us \$1400.

Last, but not least... Plane Tickets! Since we cannot buy them yet, I am estimating around \$350 a piece. That means that it will cost roughly \$2,800 for us to fly there.

This total cost, roughly \$7,000, means that if we split the amount of money equally between every youth, it would be a \$1,166.67 each. We have a lot of fund raising left to do!

Directions: Take I 91 North, Exit 17 (Wells River), then take Route 302 west (8-10 miles), then turn right on Route 232. Once you are on Route 232 you will travel another 8-10 miles. It may seem longer since the road is narrow, hilly and curvy. You will enter Groton State Forest and pass the entrance to Stillwater State Park. You will see signs for Owl's Head. A small parking lot for Owl's Head will be on the right. The Owl's Head Pavilion is very close to the parking lot. If the parking lot is full you may need to park along the side of the road.
