Jesus' Advent and the Perfect Storm

Meteorologists make their predictions about up-coming weather "events" by taking educated guesses. They gather all the data they can from satellite images, radar, infrared, past statistics and computer models, and then issue their forecast. Sometimes they're right, or close enough to right, for us to continue to consult them for information about how the weather might affect our plans.

Once in a great while meteorologists see a set of atmospheric information like they have never seen before. Certain conditions are just so and the computer models generate predictions that point to the high probability of a *significant* "event". The more unusual the set of observations and conditions, the more unique the potential outcome may be. For many meteorologists, observing a Perfect Storm is a once in a lifetime event.

All they can do though, is guess. And wait and see. Sometimes they are right and sometimes not, but they still keep their jobs and get up the next morning and try again to give us the information we need to think about how the weather may impact our lives.

The test for keeping not only your job, but also your life, for the Old Testament Prophets, was 100% accuracy all the time. (And we think we have pressured lives...) The primary calling of the Prophets was "forth-telling": Speaking the truth of God into the situation at hand and revealing His heart on the matter. Other times, the Holy Spirit would lead the Prophets into "fore-telling": The truth of God regarding the future.

So it was predicted about the Advent of Jesus Christ: A baby from the line of David, born in Bethlehem of Judea, living the way He did and doing the things He did while on earth, dying the way He did as our Redeemer and rising from death on the third day as He did, and being alive now making intercession for us as He is. The old Prophets foresaw it all in great detail and it's written down in Scripture for us to see.

When the fullness of time had come and all the conditions in the human and heavenly atmosphere were just so, Jesus did arrive: Exactly on time and to completely fulfill every prediction concerning Him. The Perfect Savior.

How does His Advent affect our plans today? How did it affect the plans of the people directly involved in the Biblical account? How are we alike in our need and our responses? Consider reading ahead the story in Luke 1 & 2 for our Advent season at Taftsville this year, and think about how Jesus' arrival impacted the lives of the characters involved. Maybe you will find yourself identifying with someone there, and Jesus will inform your plans as well in a new and fresh way.

Dirty Old Stump

Why is there a dirty old stump in the front of our meeting place?

A shoot will come up from the stump of Jesse; From his roots a Branch will bear fruit. The Spirit of the Lord will rest on him – The Spirit of wisdom and understanding, The Spirit of counsel and power, The Spirit of knowledge and of the fear of the Lord. Isaiah 11:1-3a

In I Samuel 16 we are told the story of David being chosen as Israel's future king. David is chosen from among the eight sons of Jesse. The stump of Jesse mentioned in the above passage from Isaiah refers to the ending of the Israelite kingdom of Judah, which was all but destroyed by the Assyrians, then later (586 B.C.) carried into captivity by the Babylonians. The Messiah would grow as a shoot from the stump of David's dynasty. The genealogy of Jesus, which is recorded in chapter, one of Matthew, emphasizes the importance of Jesus coming from the line of David – the stump of Jesse.

We think of the weeks before Christmas as the season of Advent; a time of waiting. This is figurative, of course, because we know that the promised Messiah has already come. For hundreds and hundreds of years throughout the Old Testament people waited for his coming. The four candles ascending the root of the old stump represent those centuries of waiting. The Christ candle on top of the stump will be lit on the last Sunday before Christmas. How blessed we are to live in the era of the green shoot from the stump of Jesse. This season celebrate the long-awaited coming of the Messiah into the world and his coming into your own life.

That is why there is a dirty old stump in the front of our meeting place.


